Herricks Cove Wildlife Festival

Since 2000, AMAS has sponsored the Herricks Cove Wildlife Festival on the first Sunday in May along the Connecticut River.

Habitat Protection

AMAS helps manage three areas for habitat conservation, education and



recreation. These are the North Springfield **Bog**, a 10,000 year old kettle bog, the Windsor Grasslands, a state -owned Wildlife Management Area and we collaborate in management

Herrick's Cove, a Vermont Important Bird Area.

Save Our Songbirds (SOS!) Coffee Club

AMAS's purchasing co-op of triple certified Bird-Friendly

shade-grown coffee, from farms that provide bird habitat by planting coffee & Beans bushes under the canopy of shade trees.



Citizen Science Projects

AMAS links members with nationwide Audubon citizen science programs such as Project FeederWatch, the Great Backyard Bird Count, the annual Christmas Bird Count, e-Bird and the VT Herp Atlas.

Scholarships

AMAS annually awards a college scholarship to a graduating area High School Senior who has shown an interest in nature and conservation. AMAS also sponsors students to attend nature camps during the summer.
